Registration & Teams

- All games will be on Saturday the June 17th, 2017. The tournament will be completed in one day. Play will be continuous (between 7:00 am and 7:00 pm).
- Games will be played using hard tennis ball used for cricket.
- Everybody is expected to bring their own cricket gear. If you can't, please let us know in advance.
- Each team can register up to Ten (10) members. Any selected EIGHT (8) will play each game.
- A group can register more than one team.
- If there are players who would like to play but cannot form a complete team, please register as individuals. We will try to connect you with others to form a team.
- Participating teams are expected to submit the list of players for the team(s) well in advance, so that events for the day can be properly planned.
- All registered teams will be grouped into 4 pools. The number of pools and rounds depends on the number of registered teams and will be communicated to the Team Captains.
- All teams are expected to be very familiar with the rules of the game and of this specific competition, as detailed in the document.
- Snacks & drinks will be complimentary for players & volunteers. Lunch will be available for purchase.
- Please bring your own chairs as it will be hard to arrange for chairs for so many players. You are welcome to bring your own canopy tent as well.
- All games will be played at two pitches at venue TBD. Exact directions to grounds will be provided in separate document.
- Please be advised that in order to keep it competitive and fun event for everyone; we are only allowing 4 players playing in a team at a time from SDCA roster.

Please remember that the sole purpose of event is to have fun while spreading the awareness about CRY and help underprivileged children back home. Let us all enjoy our favorite sport in a most sporting manner.

Game Day Info & Rules

- It is a hard tennis ball tournament, and all players are expected to wear proper sports attire. If possible white T-shirts are recommended.
- Please come at least 30 minutes before your given time. If the team doesn't arrive within 15 minutes of their scheduled time match will be awarded to the other team.
- Umpires decision will be final. In case of any dispute, organizer's decision will be final.
- To the extent possible, all games will be officiated by members of CRY volunteers and other participating teams.
- The Eight-A-Side tournament will adhere to the ICC Cricket Rules and regulations. There are no LBW and no leg-bye runs allowed. Exceptions are indicated below as well.
- There will be free hit on any no ball (like the new ICC rule).
- For medium/ fast bowlers direct ball above waist height is a no ball and for slow/spin bowlers it is above shoulder height.
- Final and Semi Finals games will be 8 overs/Innings. All other games will be 6 overs/Innings.
- A bowler is allowed to bowl maximum 2 overs in a game. This applies to Semi-Finals and a Final as well.
- Only legal over-arm full action bowling will be allowed. If suspected; umpires will give a first warning followed by cancelling that whole over. Runs scored in that over will still be awarded to batting side.
- There are no power play restrictions however minimum 2 fielders (excluding a bowler and a wicket keeper) will have to stay inside the inner circle at all times.
- It may or may not be a brand new ball before the start of each innings however we will make sure that both teams get to play with a ball that is most similar in condition before the start of their respective innings.
- The wicket keeper can be changed (but not during the over) along the course of the game and he is also allowed to bowl.
- Officials will be objective and impartial in rendering decisions.
- The above rules will be adhered to at all times throughout the > tournament. All teams are expected to cooperate fully (adhering to the rules, respecting the umpires decision etc.) with the Organizers.
